# Now, that's interesting!

From Jenny Chicone:

The Origin of Velcro®

While walking in the woods in 1941, Swiss engineer George de Mestral looked closely at the extremely tenacious nature of the burrs clinging to both his pants and dog. He sought out the help of a weaver in Lyon, France, to develop a weave structure resembling rows of miniature hooks. They tried various materials and found that cotton worked, resulting in two fabric tapes that when pressed together offered a relatively strong bond. Cotton was replaced soon thereafter with newly invented synthetic nylon, which could be heat formed rather than woven. De Mestral patented his product in 1955, naming it "Velcro," a combination of the French words *velours* ("velvet") and *crochet* ("hook").
