1940's Tidbits for the Tie-Up

Programs for the first year of meetings for CWG, 1947 **January** — At Mrs. Dunlap's, An exhibit, presented by Miss Alice Alexander and Miss Josephine Flory, told of their visit last summer to mountain craft schools in Kentucky, North Carolina, and Tennessee, specifically Berea College, KY and the Pi Beta Phi Settlement School in Gatlinburg, TN. Mrs. Ralph Watkins was elected president.

February – At Miss Dobbs', A 10 harness loom and weaving of Bronson patterns

March – At Mrs. Watkins', New materials for weaving April – At Mrs. M F. Miller's, Analysis of a pattern by Mrs. Graeffe

May – At Mr. and Mrs. Shirky's in the evening, Homemade walnut loom and weaving

June – At Mrs. Mott's, Japanese Weaving

July - September, omitted because of heat!

October – At Mrs. Neebe's, Mrs. Chilcott – Lurex- a plastic and gold shrug?, Colliers – August 30, 1947 Good As Gold
