A preliminary report was provided by Susan Burpo. There were 21 selling participants and 1862 items offered for sale. Although we had fewer sales, the percentage of items sold remains constant when compared to last year. Total sales were \$18,369.40, of which \$294.40 went into the Guild Scholarship Fund.

We want to especially recognize Irene Livingston who has served on the HES steering committee for many years, mailing the postcards, coordinating the door prizes, shopping for the opening reception, among many other tasks. Library News

This year's challenge is "Inspired by Nature."
The program for the May monthly meeting will be our show-and-tell, sharing the pieces we've made that reflect our experience of the natural world.
Our vice president and program chair, Ginny Wallace has arranged an exhibition of these pieces during July and August at the Runge Conservation Nature Center in Jefferson City. While thinking about nature, spend some time in our library finding ideas about how to express it through fiber. For instance, we have a collection of books about other cultures that portray elements of climate, landscape, flora, and fauna in ways that may be new to us.

In an effort to make the library materials more accessible to members, the cabinets are now unlocked. To lock the library door when you leave, push the button at the top of the key pad--when it blinks, turn the dead bolt.

The library is located at Access Arts, 1724 McAlester Street, Columbia, west of Old Highway 63 about two blocks south of WestLake Hardware. Enter through the door from the driveway, or, during business hours, on the upper level. The library is in a clearly designated room at the back of the ground-floor studio.
