
### **Book Reveiw**

Rebecca Fox. <u>The Weaver's Weevil: how to bust that weaving stash.</u> Independent Publishing Platform: Create Space, 2014. 134pp.

Just as a boll weevil will destroy a cotton crop, this book helps weavers blow through their accumulated stash. This book was featured in an article in "The Wheel", Ashford's fibrecraft magazine.

The article highlights one of Fox's towel designs, "Chasing Rainbows," which piqued my interest.



Fox states that since weavers inevitably accumulate partially used cones, she decided to write a book that creates designs using color theory to integrate many colors into a single handwoven towel. She chooses towels as her medium as they are practical and quick to weave.

Chapters one and two discuss basic color theory and techniques of color combining in the warp. Chapters three, four and six contain the 21 towel designs for four, six and eight shafts. Details include warping instructions, tie-up, treadling, and a picture of the finished towel. Fox does not expect the reader to use her exact colors; she inspires weavers to use their personal stash.

I ordered two copies, one for me, and one for the guild library. All weavers can use some inspiration to use up leftover yarn – (so we can buy some more!) The Weaver's Weevil does just that.
