
There are a few other changes afoot, which we will discuss at the first meeting.

### Youth Fiber Arts

We are once again holding the Youth Fiber Arts Exhibition (YFAE) next spring. The exhibition will be held in the Boone County Historical Society from Wednesday, March 21 - Saturday, March 31, 2018. We need your help!

One goal this year is to increase the number of schools/students participating in the YFAE. If we increase the number of students, we will also increase the number of prizes needed. I am asking each study group - where appropriate - to create *at least* 2 kits to be given out as honorable mention prizes. Each kit should have a specific fiber related purpose, contain everything someone needs to complete the project, should contain clear instructions for how to finish the project, placed in a one gallon zip-loc or similar bag, and should cost approximately \$10.00 if it were sold commercially. Think of this as a way to turn your stash into something a student can make to give their parents on Mother's or Father's Day! Kits must be completed and turned in to me at the February guild meeting.

### Other Events that Might Interest You

One last **Missouri Dye Workshop** at Hillcreek Fiber Studio: Saturday-Sunday, September 9-10, 2017. This workshop has always been popular with students. In the two days we forage for several local dye-plants, and through the use of several mineral salts, will evoke

over 50 color samples for students to take home, in every color of the rainbow. Dye-plants ripe and ready during this time of year include: walnuts, bidens, goldenrod, ironweed, pokeberries, elderberries, osage orange, and more. We will prepare both protein and cellulose fibers/fabrics with separate mordanting processes. Students will go home with file folders filled with samples on Cotton and Raw Silk fabrics plus Wool Roving for each dye.

**Basketmaking Class:** Thursday, 6 – 8pm, Sept. 21 – Oct 26<sup>th</sup>:

A six week series, where participants will create a number of baskets using reed, seagrass, willow, cattails, and other natural and found materials, all artful and useful. There will be a variety of techniques of weaving, rims, and completion. The final work day will be dedicated to embellishing, dyeing and paints. Any level of experience and background is applicable. Materials, tools and supplies are provided, with students welcome to bring their own tools and trimmings if desired.
