## Amy Preckshot In Memoriam

Long-time guild member and weaving mentor Amy Preckshot passed away on Thursday, December 26<sup>th</sup> at the age of 105.

Amy joined the Columbia Weavers and Spinners Guild in the late 60's. Meetings were held in members' homes and members were required to have a loom. Amy didn't have one at first, but that soon changed. Her husband, George, bought her a Macomber loom which had 4 shafts and room for 6 more. Amy soon added those extra shafts and George "did some engineering" on it. For her later weaving, Amy made the jump to a 24-shaft computer-operated Toika loom.

Figuring out how patterns work and how to get just the right hand to her fabric kept her going. Felting, weaving and spinning grew naturally from a lifetime of designing and sewing her own clothes. She moved easily from silk to wool to bamboo, and if she couldn't find the right yarn commercially, she just spun her own. Her handwoven clothing appeared in several Convergence Fashion Shows, but it's the animals that Amy was most known for.

Amy's "zoo" was her collection of stuffed animals which she designed, wove, and sewed during the late 1990's. She came across an 8-shaft draft that reminded her of a turtle's shell. She wove some fabric, drew out a pattern, and hatched her first turtles. The turtle draft, with some changes, became an alligator. Lions, giraffes, zebras, tigers, armadillos all followed along with several other designs. Guild members suggested some designs while other ideas have come from family, but they all had to be wild animals. At George's suggestion, Amy published her animal designs in "Weaving A Zoo" (2002 Amy D. Preckshot). It was her way to get others to try their hand at animals as well.

Besides her animals, Amy was the driving force behind other guild projects and the More Than Four Study Group. In 1995, she served on the initial Verna Wulfekammer Memorial Trust committee.

Later, a member of the community offered Amy a large supply of needle point wool. Amy's challenge to guild members: take some wool, make something beautiful, and put it in the Holiday Exhibition and Sale with the proceeds to benefit the guild's scholarship fund. That project raised over \$1500 to support fiber education.

Amy inspired her two daughters, Judy and Nancy, to become weavers, dyers and spinners. They both live in the Minneapolis area and are active in the Weaver's Guild of Minnesota in teaching and demonstrations at the State Fair. Her son, Geoff and daughter-in-law Rita

also share the family appreciation for handwork, whether it's sewing, felting, or weaving, and supported Amy in all her creative endeavors.

Per her wishes, there will be no services. Memorials may be made to the CWSG Educational Scholarship Fund, PO Box 124, Columbia, MO 65205 in honor of Amy.
