One of My Favorite Knots

In what seems like a lifetime ago I worked in the Florida Keys and was interested in sailing and marlinspike seamanship. I learned a basic knot then and have used it often since. It is called a stopper knot. There are many versions, each with its own characteristics. Two stopper knots can be used as buttons, the Celtic knot and the monkey fist knot. These are great for use with handmade fiber garments.

The basic figure eight knot is the one I use most often. It can be made bigger by wrapping more than once around the standing end. It makes a good knot for beading.

Here is a link to a good video about several types of stopper knots. The Celtic knot and the monkey fist knot take some practice. You have to be patient when pulling up the slack.

Give these a try and have fun adding them to your fiber work!
